What is PDO thread lifting?

PDO stands for Polydioxanone, which is a type of suture material that has been used for several decades in various types of surgeries. PDO threads are highly effective at strengthening and improving the contours of your face by filling and or lifting sagging skin.

Which areas can be treated with PDO threads?

Areas of the face and neck that can be treated include: Lower and upper cheeks, Forehead/brows, Neck and jawline, Nasolabial lines and Marionette lines.

Certain areas of the body can be treated with PDO threads as well in certain cases. These areas include: Arms and legs, Buttocks and Abdomen.

How does PDO lifting work?

PDO threads induce the production of collagen, creating a lifting effect for 2-3 years after your procedure. The threads become a support structure for your face, allowing natural collagen production to take place as the threads dissolve over a period of 3-6 months.

What happens during PDO treatment?

After receiving a local anesthetic, PDO threads will be inserted using a micro-needle or cannula. PDO thread lifting is a very customized procedure, and your healthcare professional will work closely with you in order to achieve optimal results.

When will I see results?

PDO lifting delivers immediate results which continue to improve over the next two to six months as new collagen is produced. Although the PDO threads will slowly dissolve, you'll continue to see results for up to 3 years.

How long are PDO treatment sessions?

The time of your procedure will vary based on many factors—such as the size of your treatment area and type of analgesia—but typically takes between 30 minutes to 1.5 hours.
